

The first Russian visual artist exposed at the CCP!



Russian artist Natalya Bronzova

Natalya Bronzova is the first Russian visual artist being exhibited in the Cultural Center of the Philippines! Her exhibition "From Russian soul with Love" was presented in the main lobby of the CCP by the Russian Embassy in Manila, on February 10th 2017. It was also patronage by Ms. Jewel Lobaton Pimentel, wife of the Philippines Senate President. The exhibition was officially inaugurated by distinguished guests: Russian Ambassador Igor A. Khovaev, President of the CCP Dr. Raul Sunico, Ms. Jewel Lobaton Pimentel and Ms. Cory Quirino (the photo below).

The exhibition proceeded with a Russian flavor; it began with the national anthems of the Philippines and that of the Russian Federation. Posters, cocktail tables, flowers and even the inauguration ribbon were all in Russian colors: white, blue and red! Guests where treated to Russian cuisine specialties: Olivie salad, marinated mushrooms and cabbage.

In the best Russian Imperial traditions classic performers entertained guests and complimented the visual art exhibition. In addition to Russian performers guests enjoyed outstanding piano music played by CCP President, Dr. Raul Sunico who so graciously accepted Ms Bronzova's request. This was a great gift by Philippine's greatest pianist to the artist and her guests!
