## Natalya Bronzova at Chef Jessie Rockwell Club

Chef Jessie Rockwell Club has presented the solo exhibition of Russian artist Natalya Bronzova entitled "Rainbow of my Soul." Natalya has lived in the Philippines for over five years and has written three books about the country, one of them is about the legendary First Lady Imelda Romualdez-Marcos.

At the opening ceremony, welcome speech and ribbon cutting were attended the guests of Honour: Ms. Fema Duterte, Ms. Cory Quirino, Amb. Victor Garcia with his spouse Connie and First Sec. of the Russian Embassy Vadim Velicanov.

Natalya Bronzova is the first Russian visual artist who has been exposed at the Cultural Center of the Philippines earlier this year 2017. Her exhibition "From Russian soul with Love" was presented there by the Russian Embassy and officially inaugurated by distinguished guests: Russian Ambassador Igor Khovaev, President of the CCP Dr. Raul Sunico, Ms. Jewel Lobaton Pimentel and Ms. Cory Quirino.
